
Are you Eligible for Project Re-Connect?

You must have been incarcerated in a State of Missouri Correctional Institution and such incarceration must have ended with the expiration of your sentence within the 12 month period prior to identification of being eligible for participation.

- *You must not currently be under the jurisdiction or supervision of the state agency or any federal agency and therefore must not be on probation or parole.*
- *You must be residing in the City of St. Louis*
- You must have reported you were residing in *St. Louis City* prior to your incarceration in the Missouri Department of Corrections and/or have been *sentenced in St. Louis City*.

Project Re-Connect will *work with you* on an ongoing basis to make every effort to ensure your success with re-entry into the community.

What is Project Re-Connect?

Project Re-Connect is a collaboration of Community and Faith-based organizations that will work with you (Male or Female) prior to release (approximately two (2) months to assist you in developing an Individual Support Plan of supportive services available. Immediately following your release from the Missouri Department of Corrections. Available services, if needed, in this phase will include, as appropriate, education, monitoring, mentoring, rental assistance, life skills training, assessment, job skills development, and mental health and substance abuse treatment from Project Re-Connect agencies, in order for each client to be given efficient and effective services.

The purpose is to provide a one-on-one caring and compassionate relationship that helps you stay grounded and focused on your goals you have set for yourself. It helps provide the support system that is so vital for transitioning and becoming healthy, productive citizens in your community.

What Commitment do I make?

- Re-entry is an opportunity.
- Your commitment requires a recognition that reentry is not just about individuals coming home; it is also about the homes and communities to which they return.
- Commit to making responsible choices.
- Commit to making positive changes in your life.
- Commit to the Project Re-Connect goals you have set for yourself.
- The Project Re-Connect agencies are there to help *YOU* focus on success.
- Work *with* your Case Manager.
